


HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE



Late Gobinda Kr. Singha

In the Bargiraj Dynasty, Garhbeta was a small hamlet. As found in history, this place became popular in the art and culture since the 16th century. The river Silabati was a silent spectator of many ups and downs happened in Garhbeta. There is many evidence that occurred in British Rule of oppression and its strong opposition from the people of Garhbeta. To take a frontier role in the development of the nation, the people of Garhbeta established Garhbeta High School in 1888.

It was a milestone in education. The well known leader in 'Quit India' Movement' Late Gobinda Kurnar Singha envisaged to establish one higher educational institution at Garhbeta, and he successfully did this noble work with the full support of the villagers as well as the Zamindar of this area. The auspicious day in which the 'Rarah Bangla' got the door to higher study was 13th August 1948.



Garhbeta had rich cultural heritage in its past. The bank of the holy river Silabati was the mother of many great sons like freedom fighter, educationist, big educationist, big corporate owner etc. The place with religious interest, enchanting sight of the Mahabharata fame 'Gangani' and the varied beauty of pleasant vast green forest and laterite soil attract many visitors with diverse interest on different occasions throughout the year. Much more water has passed through Silabati, Garhbeta adopted

various changes in the course of time. Fertile land, well connected road & railways and experts in various fields put Garhbeta to its inevitable position in agriculture, business and education.



The college had started its journey from Banerjee danga High School with only 50 students on 12th February 1950 and then the college was shifted to its campus constituted by the generous donation of 2.58 acres of land by the local freedom fighter Late Basanta Kumar Sarkar and 9.56 acres of land by Midnapore Zamindar Company. The college is marching forward with a vision to achieve its mission of catering to higher education for students of Paschim Medinipur and the adjoining district of Bankura and Hooghly. In the 70 years of its long journey started just with a corrugated shade in the jungle, the college has now reached significant height and possesses large buildings, well established laboratories with sophisticated instruments and provided with other basic amenities that are essential for an institution of higher learning.

At the inception the College was affiliated to the University of Calcutta with Arts and Commerce stream in intermediate standard. Affiliation upto B.A. (Pass) standard was extended in 1957, followed by B.Sc. (Pass) in 1960 and Mathematics (Hons.) and History (Hons.) in 1964. Subsequently, University of Calcutta granted B. Com (Pass), Zoology (Pass) and Botany (Pass) in 1982 and 1983 respectively. In 1985, the hunger for education of the people of undivided Midnapore received the long waiting and most coveted gift from Vidyasagar University from UGC as well as Govt. of West Bengal. And Garhbeta College became affiliated to the University and the college steadily progressed in all its dimensions of academic sphere. Now the college offers honours in fourteen subjects arts, science, and commerce along with the newly introduced Santali Hons, and four post-graduate courses in Bengali (M.A.), History (M.A.), Mathematics (M.Sc.) and Zoology (M.Sc.). Besides, there are one major vocational course (O.M.S.P.) and two professional course B.P. Ed, (N.C.T.E approved) & BCA (since 2016) also running in the college. These are remarkable achievement of Garhbeta College, and these will offer higher studies to the students of this locality at their doorstep. There has been continuous research activity in most of the departments as well. Ex-students are also in constant touch with the departments in the perspective of higher studies and research.

To send the message that the education is not only for all but for all ages, Garhbeta College has a wing of distance education in its campus namely Netaji Subhas Open University Study Centre. Soon Garhbeta College will take a frontier leadership in the propagation of higher education in the Country.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK



It is my immense pleasure to welcome all the students joining Garhbeta College for pursuing their higher studies during the session 2022-2023. Garhbeta College is one of the oldest colleges in the undivided Midnapore District in the post-independence period. The college was established in August, 1948 and we have celebrated the 75th years of establishment on 13th August, 2022 in a befitting manner. A three-day programme has been organized on and from 13-15th August, 2022 to celebrate the historic moment of our college. This academic session is very much important to all of us as it is treated as '75th Anniversary Year' of Garhbeta College which will be completed by a similar colourful occasion on 13th August 2023. A beautiful souvenir has been published to commemorate the great occasion. The college authority has decided to construct a 'SMARAK BHAVAN' (the 2nd floor of Ambedkar Bhavan) for the 75th anniversary of the college which will be inaugurated during the concluding ceremony on 13th August, 2023.

The college is now upgraded as an ideal place of education in a vast area (22 acre approx.) also in a very beautiful location in a close vicinity to 'GANGONI' (the 'Grand Canyon of Bengal') in the bank of river Silabati with its own scenic beauty like a 'TOPOBAN'. The greenery of our college is a great beauty that attracts all the visitors. This beauty of the campus alongside the road also catches the eye of every passer-by. It is our dream to promote this institution to be an ideal educational hub of modern times. We have recently resumed our offline classes after recovering the serious loss in the teaching learning process due to Covid 19 pandemic restrictions during the past two sessions (2020- 2021 & 2021-2022). The college authority is now trying to compensate the loss as much as possible and taking many effective measures for facing the 2nd cycle of NAAC assessment during this year with a target to achieve a much better score than the previous one.

A galaxy of eminent teachers has served this institution with their endless efforts to teach their students, many of their former students are in several higher positions in India and abroad. Maintaining the heritage of this institution, the present enriched faculty members of the college have tried their best with its sole objective of providing quality education. The faculty strength is very high at present (more than 100) in the college. Many quality teachers have joined the college through WBCSC in various subjects in the recent past. There is only one full time teaching post lying

vacant in Physiology. The nonteaching staff strength in the college is also adequate after recruitment of staff in the permanent vacancies.

The college is now in a position of enjoying greater infrastructural facilities due to renovation and expansion of existing college building. A new Boys' Hostel has been constructed with two other existing hostels (one for Ladies and another for Boys) in the college campus with a capacity to accommodate 75 more students from the backward classes with an attached 'Guest Quarter' for the visitors, funded by the State Government. The college is already equipped with various facilities like beautiful football ground, Gymnasium with multigym facilities & physiotherapy unit, Volleyball Court, Kho-Kho Field, NSS with Four Units, NCC (two companies) with firing range, modernized College Library and some other valuable assets. Many other recent developments have been initiated like modernization of class rooms (ICT enabled class room) and improvement of laboratories considering the modernization of teaching learning process as per CBCS curriculum implemented by the Vidyasagar University. The college library has been recently modernized with KOHA software for accessing the students online including installation of software for accessing books from home. The college website also upgraded and developed with a new domain (ac.in) giving much emphasis on online teaching learning processes in the Covid-19 pandemic situation. Besides teaching, the college has been giving due emphasis in research activities, a number of Research Projects funded by the UGC and other funding agencies are conducted by the faculties over the years.

The college is successfully running Netaji Subhas Open University (NSOU), a distance learning University as study center since 2004 affiliating various UG & PG courses for both Arts and Science. The B.P.Ed course in the college is also running successfully since 2003 with various programmes organized by the students and the faculty members. The newly introduced four Post Graduate courses and BCA course are running successfully since few years. A few remarkable successes were gained by a student of PG Mathematics in higher studies and notable achievement has been made by many BCA students in campus recruitment programme of some reputed companies like Wipro, Infosys, Deloitte etc. and also in ICICI Bank and already got placement in those concerns in recent past. Keeping in view the demand of time, the college has taken special drive to revive Commerce education with Honours in Accounting & Finance.

The IQAC of the college has introduced 'Incentive programme' for the students and teachers of the college with due approval of the Governing of the college for quality education and also to encourage the students and teachers for higher studies / research. The faculty exchange programme has been initiated with three colleges for few subjects to improve the quality of education during this pandemic period. A few departments have organized seminar at National and international level with some eminent speakers of international reputations. A blended mode of education has been introduced in various departments, especially in PG courses since Covid 19 period. The guardians were also met offline as well as online in various subjects during this session for sharing information about the progress of their wards and for improving

Parent-Teacher relationship as well. The college fees for all the existing streams (both UG & PG) have been waived to a considerable extent keeping in mind the financial condition of the guardians during the present Covid Pandemic situation. The Alumni Association of the college has been reconstructed for making relationship between the former students and the present students for their future benefit.

Ragging in the college campus is totally banned in all its departments, constitutional units, including all its premises (academic, residential, sports, canteen etc.) and in all means of transportation of the students whether public or private and anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. ICC (Internal Complaint Cell) has been activated after the pandemic period as per guidelines of UGC.

I am very much proud of my institution for having a very co-operative Governing Body, faculty members, non-teaching staff and other associated staff. The Governing Body of the college has enabled me running a fair and transparent administration and has taken many bold positive steps to improve efficiency in order to provide quality education. I am also grateful for valuable guidance from Vidyasagar University, local authorities like Garhbeta Block-I Panchayet Samity, Police Station & Garhbeta Health Centre. I am also grateful to all our patrons, well-wishers, guardians and local people for their full co-operation enabling me running the college in a smooth way. We would always look forward for constructive and valuable suggestions for paving the path of a better tomorrow and reaching towards a desired destination.

With the rapid growth of IT (Information Technology) industry in India, the demand for computer professional is increasing day by day. This increasing growth of IT industry has created a lot of opportunities for the computer graduates. Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA) is one of the popular courses among the students who want to build up their career in the IT field. This course provides a lot of opportunities to the students who are interested in computer field and desirous of working in the IT Sector.

Keeping in view the above-mentioned opportunities, Garhbeta College has introduced BCA Course in the year 2017 for making the local youth suitable for IT industry or different IT related job. Since then, several systems support with adequate number of

computers and other logical equipment have been gradually upgraded to cater the hunger of the newly admitted young minds. A perfect cope for the library facility gets ready with referral books and Journals in the Central library of our college. For the Computer Application Course, as the technology changes rapidly every unit of time, the department and its faculties are careful to feed the students with updated knowledge to cope with the demand of time. The level of education imparted to the students makes them capable in reaching the height of their career in this highly demanding field.

Being a technical department, it takes every effort for the students for participating in different campus recruitment programme of different reputed IT firms across India. The department gathers recruitment news from different informative websites and shares that news among the students about the pool compassing organized at different places in India. The department also prepares the academic credentials of all eligible students and forwards the same to different renowned IT companies for their campus recruitment programme.

It is a great honour for the BCA Department that, this year, some ex-students of the department got placed in renowned IT Companies like Wipro and Infosys in their Campus Recruitment Programme and one pass out of 1st batch is recruited as Senior Officer Trainee in ICICI Bank.

Thus, from the viewpoint of employability, the ultimate destiny of a course, this department has proved its worth within a very short span of time and hope it will uphold the prestige, fame, and glory to enrich the credential of the department and the college.

Commerce As a Career: Scope for better Employability

Commerce is a dynamic discipline which keeps pace with the changes in the real business world. Many charming career opportunities are available in this discipline. Chartered Accountant, Company Secretary, Cost & Management Accountant, Management Executive, to name a few, are the output of Commerce and are marked as distinguished professions from the view point of prestige, status, and earnings. Apart from these, because of some recent changes in the Government policies, Commerce education, in its revised form, finds better prospect and greater employment opportunity in the present scenario. So, besides a Commerce student, a non-commerce student (securing either 45% marks in Mathematics in Madhyamik or passed HS with mathematics) too can take a diversion and build up his/her career with B. Com Honours in Accounting & Finance to the fulfilment of basic eligibility criteria for admission. However, some grounds are mentioned below which may be taken into consideration for choosing Commerce stream as future career option.

- [1] WBSSC has extended the benefit to the Commerce candidates for becoming a teacher in secondary level through Upper Primary TET Examination according to its revised Norm, 2016 in addition to the scope of this at the H.S. level. Teaching in College, University and Management Institute is also open to them.
- [2] A Commerce student has multiple career options as against others and apart from master's in commerce after B. Com he/she may pursue different Professional Courses like Chartered Accountancy, Cost & Management Accountancy (Costing), Company Secretary, Chartered Financial Analyst, Certified Public Accountant, Stock broker Certification Courses, Indian Institution of Banking & Finance Courses, MBA, different Management Courses with diverse range of specialization.
- [3] The employment opportunity of a Commerce student in Banking sector is greater as some posts of Banks are reserved for Commerce career. Pursuing a Banking course /training after graduation, a commerce student can find Banking job easier.
- [4] There is an officer's level competitive exam. named as West Bengal Audit & Accounts Service Recruitment Examination conducted by the WBPSA where candidates with B. Com or equivalent commerce degrees only are eligible. Commerce graduates also find a dominating position in another competitive exam named as West Bengal Works Accountant Recruitment Examination conducted by the WBPSA.
- [5] Sea changes in the various parameters in the economy and some newly emerged field in the changed scenario like, maintaining Accounts through Accounting Packages, Online Income Tax, GST, tremendous growth of e-commerce and online trading, digital marketing, massive use of computer in almost all activities etc. have widened the scope of employment of a Commerce student.
- [6] Goods & Services Tax (GST) which has come into effect has revamped the existing business process and it has become a challenge for the business houses but an opportunity for the Commerce students.
- [7] More importantly, Commerce students find a vast area of self-employment in the fields like Computerized Accounting, Tax Consultancy, TRP, Investment Consultancy, Online Share Trading, Project Consultancy and other computer related works.
- [8] Over and above, the success rate of commerce students in different competitive examinations is comparatively better.

Because of the reasons mentioned above the demand of Commerce with its updated curriculum on Accounting & Finance tends to increase throughout the state. So, the students are offered to take admission in B. Com Honours in Accounting & Finance in our College, subject to the fulfilment of the eligibility criteria and availability of seats. The College assures best teaching from its qualified and experienced faculties and other educational facilities like use of computers, library books, career guidance etc. for bright future of the students.

Brief Information about OMSP (Major)

Office Management and Secretarial Practice (OMSP) is a self-financing vocational under-graduate course and any candidate having OMSP degree is eligible to get any Govt. or public or private sector job and services where eligibility criteria is graduation. OMSP degree holders are also eligible to appear in School Service Commission (SSC) examination as a candidate in the post of a general teacher in any of his/her general paper opted in undergraduate studies. Students of OMSP have a bright future in Job Prospect Avenue. This course generates skill in Govt. office management as well as in large merchant office management. This course is so designed that a student with this degree can be an expert manager in various sectors. In the introduction of advanced technology and downsizing the space as well as number of employees in the office, it became difficult to work out all the assignment in time. However, in the proper way by means of exact use of manpower, it may be possible to overcome the situation. Keeping view of this scenario in mind we put forward our best effort to cover the full university syllabus in teaching to motivate students in the direction of human resource management as well customer satisfaction.

In Office Management and Secretarial Practice (OMSP) course we teach office management, secretarial practice, book keeping, accountancy, fundamentals of computers, internet, Tally software package, HTML, Access, E-mail, Computer type, shorthand, spoken English, Skill to develop personality, letter drafting in various manners. Each topic has both theory and practical part.

It is a three-year Major vocational course consisting of 800marks major, two general papers each 300 marks and in part-III three compulsory subject such as Bengali, English, and Environmental studies each with 50 marks. Along with the OMSP major course, one student can choose any two general papers following the restriction laid down by the college authority.

Rules of the College

GENERAL RULES: Admission to the college implies an undertaking on the part of the student to confirm willingness to be loyal to college rules & regulations and directives to be issued from time to time by the college authority. Care to be taken in the following matters:

1. Students must be polite and loyal in manner and behaviors.
2. Loitering, Shouting and Smoking in the campus are strictly forbidden.
3. Postering, writing in walls and spitting in the College Campus are offensive.
4. Raging is a crime; it is strictly prohibited.
5. Students must enter the College with valid Identity Card.
6. At least 75% attendance in classes is essential for University Examination.
7. Every student should follow the students Notice Board as well as departmental Notice Board, college website regularly for information.
8. The College authority reserves the right to expel any unruly student from the College at any time.
9. Students must come to the college in the uniform as specified by the college.
10. Use of Cell Phone and wearing a Cap in the College Campus is restricted.

STUDENT UNIFORM:

- For Boys : Black trouser and Sky-Blue Shirt.
For Girls : White Salwar and sky blue kameez with white dupatta or white Saree with Sky blue border (paar) and sky-blue blouse.
Professional courses like B.P.Ed. and BCA have separate uniform.

PAYMENT OF FEES:

1. All payments are to be made in cash in the cash section of the College after the admission to 1st year. Online payment system is expected to be introduced shortly.
2. Payments for field classes and excursions, where required, will have to be made in addition to the admission charge.
3. The entire payment of fees for Self-Financing Courses shall have to be made at the time of admission.

CHANGE OF COURSES AND SUBJECTS:

Students of the 1st semester willing to change subject/subjects of a course may apply for change within 30 days from the date of admission. But all these changes are guided by the rules prescribed by the College / Vidyasagar University.

CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION:

Any suppression or misstatement of facts or violation of college rules by the students at the time of admission must lead to cancellation of his/her studentship. The authority will not be responsible for that. The students must be cautious about the rules and eligibility at the time of admission.

All admissions are provisional. Consequence upon the cancellation of their admission for reason deemed valid by this College/University, the students will not get refund of any fees except the caution deposits as per rules of the college on the dates to be notified by the college.

Garhbeta College maintains a campus free of any discrimination based on religion, caste, language or gender. A zero-tolerance policy for any such discrimination is rigorously enforced.

A student remaining absent for fifteen consecutive working days after the commencement of classes without any valid reason will be liable to be dismissed from his/her studentship.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT AND CLASS TESTS:

As per CBCS curriculums in all streams, class tests will be conducted for internal assessment.

Note: **(a)** To appear in the class test in a subject, a student must attend 75% of total classes conducted by the concerned department. Schedule of class test examination for honours subject will be declared by the respective departments; however, for general subjects, students are advised to follow the department/college notice board and the college website.

(b) There will be no internal assessment of Practical papers.



COLLEGE ACTIVITIES

SAHELI: THE WOMENS' CELL



The Women's Cell, 'Saheli' of Garhbeta College started its journey in the year of 2011. The college authority feels that there must be a platform for the women employees and lady students at the college to share their views, raise their voice against offences and to bring those to the knowledge of the higher authority of the college. 'Saheli' also deals with undesirable incidents concerning women in the college campus and address different social issues.

Objectives:

1. To prevent gender discrimination & sexual harassment in the college campus.
2. To deal the cases of sexual harassment, in a time bound manner aiming at ensuring services to the victims and terminating the harassment.
3. To recommend appropriate punitive action against the guilty to the higher authority of the college.
4. To grow awareness among the girl students and female staff of the college about women health & women legislative support provided by the constitution of India.

Functions:



1. Promotion of gender equality and documentation & dissemination. Organization of awareness programme for girl students and female staff on different aspects of gender amity, health management & legal rights of women.
2. Consultation with the Lawyer, Doctor and /or a counselor as required.
3. The women's cell 'Saheli' shall be ethically accountable to the complainants as well as the accused and shall do its utmost to provide justice for each Programmes undertaken by 'Saheli' each complaint to the best of its ability.

Programmes undertaken by ‘Saheli’:

1. ‘Saheli’, the Women’s cell, Garhbeta College had organized a special lecture on ‘8-i Marcher Itihas, Lingaboisamy’ on 23rd March, 2022. Garhbeta College strongly encourages gender parity and is constantly working towards providing a conducive environment for efficient and effective communications between the employees and students. Men, women and Transgender need to be sensitized towards gender issues, the boundaries that exist between colleagues and how such boundaries are crossed. The students and faculty of the college also need to be constantly informed about the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace Act, 2013, Gender harassment, Gender discrimination and Gender sensitization. In order to address such concerns a one-day special talk was organized by ‘Saheli’. The objective of the special talk was to sensitize the participants on gender issues, to help them be aware of gender biases, to help them resolve interpersonal conflicts arising from gender issues and to enable them to act assertively and respond to challenges in workplace. Dr. Saswati Ghosh, eminent social worker, writer and Associate Professor of City College talked about patriarchy, violence in the family as well as issues related to gender inequality in our society. She also talked about stereo-type concept of human-mind about diagnosis of gender. She also talked about the history of celebration of 8th March. The audiences participated actively in the open house discussion and were appreciative about getting an opportunity to know and discuss gender discrimination, gender sensitivity. She also asked the students to come forward for making a new gender-discrimination free society. Around 250 participants from neighboring colleges, schools and Home Institution attended this special talk.
2. Advancing gender equality in the context of the climate crisis and disaster risk reduction is one of the greatest global challenges of the 21st century. Women are increasingly being recognized as more vulnerable to climate change impacts than men are, as they constitute the majority of the world’s poor and are more dependent on the natural resources which climate change threatens the most. On 8th March, 2022, Garhbeta College celebrated International Women’s Day with “Gender equality today for a sustainable tomorrow” as the heart of the discourse. Principal inaugurated the programme and delivered his lecture to make the audience sensitive about giving every person respect, comfort, care and treating them with humanity. Then Prof. (Dr.) Sushil Kumar Ghosh, the Coordinator of IQAC, Prof. (Dr.) Santimoy Patra, GB member of the college, Prof. (Dr.) Rita Sil, Joint Convener of the Women’s Cell and Prof. (Dr.) Sajed Biswas, Secretary of Teachers’ Council gave speech on their individual mind set towards gender sensitization. Later Prof. (Dr.) Prithwish Kumar Hait elaborated the theme of the

programme and told the audience how awareness raising in educational set- up, at workplace and in society can eliminate gender-based prejudice and thereby change stereotyped working cultures as regards to the roles and abilities of women and men, including attitude towards women in leadership positions.



ICC (Internal Complaints Committee)

The college has constituted the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC), as per the recommendation of UGC for higher education institutions. The said committee ensures a sexual harassment-free environment, zero tolerance of gender-based violence, and also deals with gender sensitization program to evaluate, assist and support for all those who are studying or working in the institute and addresses the harassment complaint (if any) following as per Section 4(1) of the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013.

PROCEDURE FOR FILING A COMPLAINT WITH ICC

- Sexual Harassment complaints must be hand-written or typed on paper.
- The nature of the complaint, as well as dates and locations, should be fully specified.
- As per stipulation of the Act the aggrieved person can make the written/typed complaint to HOI within a period of three months from the date of incident and in case of a series of incidents, within a period of three months from the date of last incident.
- The complaint must not be anonymous.

Effective Turning Around in the Post-Pandemic Period

The greatest challenge was to wean students off the home-bound online teaching-learning-evaluation and bring them back to the campus. A number of the students who had passed out of schools came to college for the first time after two years. The college took up this challenge and ensured a welcoming environment for them, where they saw teachers and all the people of the college are happy to be back on campus and excited to start frontal teaching-learning-evaluation process back again.

The college has taken this re-opening of campus as an opportunity too, to reflect upon the lesson the lockdown period provided. It was about how the non-human natural world thrived and grew happily while normal human activities were suspended. It proved how the so-called normal human activities were harmful to the environment. Our college has rolled out policies and decisions about making the campus green in all possible aspects.

Re-learning to live in harmony with nature has been the focus of our college in the post-pandemic era. Our environmental policy, energy policy, water and waste management policy and developing a green campus is gradually materializing.

We as a higher education institute has learnt the lesson that humans cannot grow intellectually or materially by being at disharmony with the nature. We thus have adopted the green way to ensure a productive and holistic educational environment for our students.

NSS

There are four NSS units in the College headed by four Programme Officers to undertake various activities as per guidelines of Vidyasagar University. NSS is offered to the students with a view to develop their personality through various Social and Community services undertaken alongside their course of study.

To ensure the mental as well as personality development of students, Garhbeta college has introduced four NSS units having capacity 100 volunteers in each.
